Human Goodness offers an original pragmatic moral theory that revives and revitalizes the classical Greek concept of happiness. I explain that the Greeks define happiness as an activity that we may perform for its own sake. I then demonstrate that we may use the American pragmatic method to discover and to define innumerable activities of this kind. My demonstration rests on the modest assumption that our happiness takes not one ideal form but many empirical forms.

Other Selves presents a systematic integration of Aristotle's analysis of personal friendship with his analysis of political friendship in the *Nicomachean Ethics* and the *Politics*. I also show how Aristotle's theory of friendship, both personal and political, provides a counterpoint to contemporary ethical and political theories.
