

**Triad Essay #3**  
**History 106**  
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Students should now be fairly familiar with this exercise. Nonetheless, I would emphasize the following as you prepare these essays. Be sure to consider and deploy all texts in the Sources reader that may be relevant to addressing the given set of issues. Review those readings carefully to determine which of them will be of the most utility to you in composing your answer. It is simply not acceptable to ignore important and obviously pertinent texts in writing your paper. As before, use the essay as an opportunity to demonstrate the depth of your engagement with and contemplation of the material. This means thinking very carefully about what is relevant and about which materials will best allow you to assemble an effective, informed, and compelling essay. Because the essay is short, avoid bland, vacuous, or superfluous statements in favor of information that makes arguments or provides evidence. Without stating that the fate of the universe depends on it, I cannot exaggerate how important it is for you to think hard about good topic sentences and to *proofread* your papers carefully.

You may write on any of the triads listed below. For this exercise, you should understand fascism in a broad sense as encompassing not just Italian Fascism, but also Nazism and similar movements of the far right. In the glorious tradition of providing students with choice, I include the possible triads for the essay below.
